



BARLEY

Barley is a popular Canadian crop, with over 9.7 million metric tonnes¹ produced from 6.6 million acres in 2025, representing 8% of total area planted to oilseed and cereal crops. Barley represents approximately \$2.6 billion to Canadian farmers.

In Atlantic Canada, 98,098 metric tonnes were produced in 2025, with Prince Edward Island having the largest production in the region at 69,297 metric tonnes.

With 62,700 acres in Atlantic Canada in 2025 barley comprised 23% of the area seeded to oilseeds and cereals with an estimated farm value of \$26.4 million.

Currently, the Atlantic Grains Council has conducted various on-farm trials on barley to determine the agronomic impact on yield, quality, and changes in the soil. The results of this work are on the Council's website. Barley is also part of the Atlantic Grains Council's Yield Enhancement Network.
