

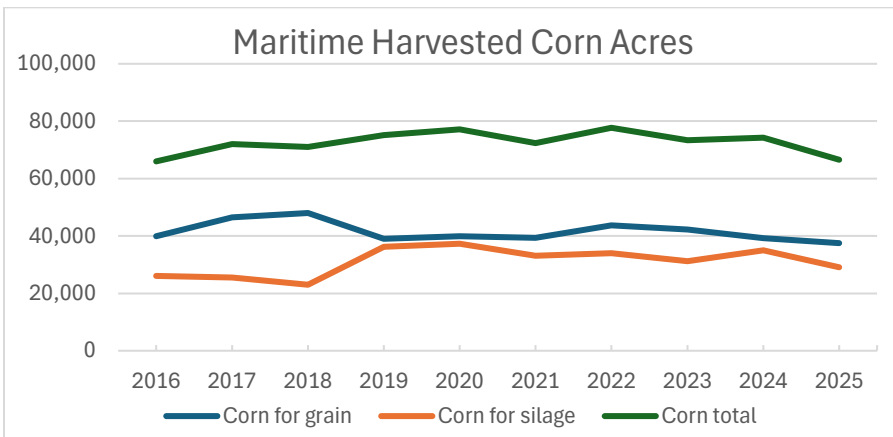


# CORN

Corn is a popular crop in Canada with 3.6 million acres<sup>1</sup> devoted to grain production with an additional 0.76 million acres used for silage in 2025. Grain corn, by tonnage, is the second largest cereal crop grown in Canada, with an estimated 14.8 million tonnes produced in 2025.

In Atlantic Canada, corn represents approximately 25% of the area seeded to cereals and oilseeds. The 37,500 acres devoted to grain production produced an estimated 103,750 tonnes and the 29,100 acres in silage provided an estimated 330,000 tonnes of silage. Nova Scotia is the leading corn producing province in the region.

In 2025 grain corn produced an estimated on-farm value of \$3.2 billion for Canadian farms. In Atlantic Canada the \$22.8 million value of grain corn makes it a valuable cereal crop.
