



OATS

Oats is the fourth largest cereal crop grown in Canada, with 3.9 million tonnes¹ produced in 2025 with a value of \$1.2 billion. In Atlantic Canada, approximately 30,000 tonnes were produced in 2025 with an estimated value of \$9.2 million.

New Brunswick was the leading oat producing province in the region with a production of 21,024 tonnes of oats in 2025.

Oats comprised over 2.5 million acres throughout Canada, with 27,300 acres in Atlantic Canada. Harvested area of oats in 2025 represented 3.9% of total area in cereals and oilseeds in Canada and 10.2% of the area in Atlantic Canada seeded to cereal and oilseed crops.

Currently, the Atlantic Grains Council has conducted on-farm trials evaluating the impact of various levels of nitrogen combined with fungicide treatment on oats to determine the impact on yield, quality, and changes in the soil. The results of this work are on the Council's website.
